The implementation of the 1972 Local Government Act on April 1st, 1974 resulted in the creation of the nonmetropolitan county of North Yorkshire. It was formed mainly from the North Riding of Yorkshire except for 2 small parts going to Cleveland and Durham; the northern part of the West Riding (including Harrogate, Knaresborough and Selby); and the northern part of the East Riding (including Filey).

North Yorkshire Schools Athletic Association was formed in 1974 to organise and supervise athletics in the new county.

The association had almost immediate success with Gillian Smith winning the Senior 100 metres hurdles silver medal at the 1975 ESAA Track and Field Championship. Its first ESAA champion was David Parish in the Intermediate 1500 metres steeplechase at the 1977 ESAA Track and Field Championship.

Details follow of a North Yorkshire ESAA competitor who has gone on to have a successful career in another sport :

TRIATHLON - SAM DICKINSON

Sam represented North Yorkshire when finishing 3rd in the 2015 ESAA Senior Cross Country.

In 2022 he was a member of the Great Britain World Triathlon Sprint Mixed Relay team which won the silver medal. Incidentally the team was made up solely of former ESAA competitors, namely Georgia Taylor-Brown, Sophie Coldwell, Alex Yee and Sam.

Later in the year the same team represented England when winning the Commonwealth Games Triathlon Mixed Relay.

At the 2024 Olympic Games in Paris he won a bronze medal as a member of the Great Britain Triathlon Mixed Relay team.
